NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the current ISSA Procedural Rules (as modified by the PCISA District Rules).
- **1.2** The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Pacific Coast Interscholastic Sailing Association (PCISA) in conjunction with Cabrillo Beach Yacht Club (CBYC).

2. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- **2.1** Competing schools must be members of ISSA and meet ISSA eligibility rules as prescribed in the ISSA Procedural Rules.
- **2.2** Selection of competing schools will be in accordance with the current PCISA District Rules. The regatta has 22 berths. The PCISA Board has the final authority over berths to this regatta.
- **2.3** Eligible schools may only send 1 team, which shall consist of an A and B Division. A minimum of 4 sailors and maximum of 8 sailors are allowed per team.
- 2.4 Eligible schools shall enter by completing the online entry form located at: <u>https://hssailing.org/machform/view.php?id=22982</u> and submitting payment <u>online by 1700 hours on</u> <u>Friday, April 7th.</u>
- **2.5** Selected Schools unable to compete must notify the PCISA President (<u>mikesego@ussclb.org</u>) as soon as possible so PCISA can reallocate vacant berths. There are penalties for no-shows after the entry deadline.

3. FEES

The entry fee is \$200.00 for the first 4 sailors and 1 coach and \$40.00 for each additional team member. Entry fee includes PCISA sails, a long sleeve t-shirt for each paid sailor and coach, BBQ lunch on the beach during racing (weather permitting) and snacks after racing each day. Additional t-shirts may be available for purchase. All payments shall be made via the online registration system by the deadlines.

5. BOATS & SAILS

- **5.1** Each Team shall bring a complete CFJ Class Legal Boat in excellent racing condition. The team will enter this boat in the regatta rotation and use this boat in the first rotation.
- **5.2** Each boat shall be inspected prior to the Competitors' meeting on Saturday.
- **5.3** Each boat is required to use the sails supplied by PCISA.
- **5.4** A limited number of Charter Boats are available by reservation on the Online Entry Form for \$200 each (for the regatta). Questions on charter boats contact Mike Segerblom, <u>mikesego@ussclb.org</u>

6. RACING AREA & LAUNCHING

The racing area will be in the Los Angeles Harbor inside the Upper Breakwater area. All boats will launch from and return to CBYC each day.

7. PRACTICE

Teams wishing to practice on Friday, April 21st shall email bayoconnor@aol.com. Practice is allowed from 1400-1700 hours; boats are not allowed on the water outside of this time period. Teams may arrive at the CBYC any time after 1300 hours on Friday.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions and other documents will be posted on the official regatta notice board and on Techscore. Paper copies will NOT be available on site.

9. COACHING

Coaching may be done from the rotation site (pier, docks, or beach). Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not have any contact with competitors while on the water from reporting Saturday to ending Sunday unless explicitly permitted by the OA. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and teams associated with the infringing support personnel from the races following and/or preceding the infraction, at the discretion of the jury.

10. PARTICIPATION

With the exception of RRS Rule 4, each school shall compete in all scheduled races, or if unable to compete, shall take care of their assigned boat. Any school breaking this rule, without permission of the Race Committee, is subject to severe disciplinary actions by Jury and/or the PCISA.

11. JUDGING/PROTEST

- **11.1** Judges or observers may be on the water. They will act in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules, Appendix 4. If observers are on the water Appendix P (as modified by ISSA Procedural Rules PR 14.c) will be in effect.
- **11.2** Protests will be handled in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. The Jury may hear protests between races on the water or in a designated location determined by the Race Committee.

12. RIGHT OF APPEAL

Pursuant to RRS 70.5 (a) in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rule 20 (b) there shall be no appeal of decisions of the Protest Committee or Judges at this event.

13. TROPHIES

Prizes will be awarded to schools placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th in the regatta. The top school will have its name engraved on the perpetual Wakeman trophy. The top 4 teams in accordance with PCISA District Rules (12.3 & 9) will qualify for the ISSA Mallory Trophy Nationals.

14. HOUSING

Housing is the responsibility of each team.
