Host: Beaufort Yacht and Sailing Club Beaufort, SC

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the Procedural Rules for ISSA and the SAISA Supplemental Rules.

2. Notice to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the clubhouse riverside porch.

3. Changes to Sailing Instructions

Changes in the Sailing Instructions may be made at any time and posted in writing on the notice board or, on the water, communicated to each boat before her warning signal. Oral changes may be given only on the water.

4. Boats and Equipment

4.1 420's will be provided and ISSA procedural Rules regarding equipment will apply.
4.2 Competitors shall report any damage to or loss of equipment, however slight, to the race committee/organizing authority's representatives immediately upon completion of the race in which it occurs.

5. Signals Made Ashore

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the base of BYSC flagpole.

5.2 When AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 20 minutes" in the race signal AP. 5.3 Code flag "L" with one sound signal means a change to the SIs has been posted.

6. Schedule of Races

Saturday 24 October 2015 0800 Arrival and Check-in 0900 Competitors' Meeting 0945 The warning for the first race of the day. Additional races will follow.

7. Racing area

The Racing area will be on the Beaufort River between the McTeer Bridge and the marshes in front of downtown Beaufort.

8. Courses

8.1 Attachment "A" shows the course description and letter designation that will be used.8.2 The Course to be sailed in each individual race will be displayed on the signal boat no later than the warning signal for that race.

9. Marks

Rounding marks will be red balls. The Start/Finish mark will be a yellow flag.

10 Breakdowns

Breakdown requests shall be filed in the same manner as protests.

11. Safety

11.1 Per ISSA-PR 2.2, competitors shall wear USCG approved Type III or V lifejackets. Inflatable type lifejackets are not permitted.

11.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee either before leaving the course, or if that is impossible, immediately after arriving ashore.

12. Start/Finish

12.1 The races will be started in accordance with RRS Appendix S-Sound-Signal Starting System.

12.2 The Start/Finish line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat and the course side of the port-end S/F mark.

13. Recalls.

13.1 As a courtesy the race committee will attempt to hail boats identified as OCS along with a sound signal. Failure of the boats to hear the hail or the sound, or the order, in which the hail was made, shall not be grounds for redress.

13.2 After a General Recall the provisions of RRS 30.1 shall apply (around the ends rule) except that I Flag need not be displayed. This changes RRS 30.1.

14. Shortening a Race

In accordance with ISSA PR 7.7 (d) races will not be shortened. This changes RRS Rule 32.

15. Time Limit

15.1 The time limit for the first boat to finish the race will be 30 minutes.

15.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat will be awarded their existing position. This changes RRS 35.

16. Penalty

A One-Turn Penalty is required for an infraction of a Part 2 Rule. This changes RRS 44.1 and 44.2.

17. Protests

17.1 Protest procedure will be in accordance with ISSA PR Part VI.

17.2 Written protests shall be filed at the registration desk within 30 minutes of the last competitor's arrival ashore after the race in which the incident occurred.

17.3 A boat intending to protest an incident that occurs in the racing area shall notify the race committee finish boat of their intention to protest including the sail number of the boat to be protested.

17.4 Per ISSA PR 8(b), competitors shall not communicate with a coach before reporting to the race committee there intent to protest.

18. Scoring

18.1 Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA rule 9 will be used. Ties will be resolved per ISSA PR 11 (c).

18.2 Three races in A Division and B Division shall constitute a regatta.

19. Coaching

19.1 Team leaders, coaches, parents, other support personnel, and spectators shall not go afloat in the racing area and shall comply with ISSA PR 8.

19.2 Record of Participation forms are required for this points regatta.

20. Official Notice for All Participants

All sailors shall comply with ISSA PR 5 (a) (conduct) on or off the water for the time period specified in the Rules.

21. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority and the host club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
