


## **Appendix C**





We plan to sail High School Gold and College on one racecourse and High School Silver and Bronze on a separate course, both close off the beach near the Granada Launch Ramp (GLR). All team "camps" will be on the beach on either side (North/West & South/East of the GLR). There are bathrooms adjacent to the GLR (Note: The restaurant/snack bar is not open). All boats will be launched and stored on the GLR & adjacent beach. See our Rose Bowl Regatta Maps attached.

Below are some important items for all teams to know and remember (please also read the Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, Maps (there are 3 in same doc) and other documents as they become available on Techscore).

<u>Practice</u> – We will have safety boats available (coaches can share) and be conducting practice on Friday, January 3<sup>th</sup> after 1pm. Coach boats will leave from the US Sailing Center but all CFJs (except as noted in the next sentence) will be on the beach/cement pad at the Granada Launch Ramp. All "out-of-state" College or High School Teams that plan to practice on Friday should email <u>mikesego@ussclb.org</u> (put "Rose Bowl Practice" {only} in the Subject Line) so boats are reserved for you (you will pick up CFJs at the USSCLB). Boats must be reserved by Noon Friday. Unless other arrangements are confirmed, boats not picked up by 2:30 pm at the USSCLB will be given away for practice first come/first serve. Please resend emails about practice beginning Jan. 1<sup>st</sup>! Note: Sails will only be provided to out-of-state schools for Friday Practice other teams must bring your own for practice.

<u>Trailer Parking</u> – Boats and trailers should not arrive before 10am on Friday, January 3rd. All boats will be launched and stored on the beach/GLR. Trailers will be stored in specially marked areas (see aerial photos) of the adjacent parking lot. Trailer parking (in the special zones) and boat parking (on the beach on dollies) is free for registered regatta participants. All boats and trailers must be removed from the Granada/Belmont parking lot and beaches by 7:00pm on Sunday, January 5<sup>th</sup>. There will be overnight security from 5pm to 8am on Friday and Saturday nights for boats on the beach and trailers in the parking lot. Please stay out of these areas during these hours to avoid confusion. Bring good wide tire dollies for beach launching!

**Car Parking** – Parking is available in the parking lot on the Ocean side of Ocean Blvd from Granada Ave. north to Bennett Ave. ALL cars must pay to park from 8am – 6pm. The fee is \$0.50 per 15 minutes (\$2 per hour) up to \$20 for the day, which must be paid by debit/credit card. Parking for the dinner on Saturday evening (at the US Sailing Center) is available on Ocean Blvd, in the spaces (Free) North of the USSCLB (including the Restricted Red Zone Boat Owner Parking - Free) and in the lot at Bayshore/54<sup>th</sup>/Claremont (Pay here until 6pm) on Ocean Blvd.

**Registration/Check In** – Everyone has signed up and paid through online registration, you do not have to wait in the registration line(s) unless: you have pre-ordered t-shirts to pick up, if you wish to purchase additional Saturday Night Dinner Tickets (by 10am Saturday) and/or you wish to inform us that you will not be using all of your Saturday Night Dinners (4 per registered team) so we don't waste food. Registration/Check In will occur under the tent on the beach adjacent to the Snack Bar/Bathroom building and GLR area beginning at 8:30am on Saturday morning.

**Boat Inspection** – You must have your boat inspected prior to launching on Saturday morning. Boat inspectors will be in the boat storage area on the beach with clip boards. They will complete an inspection form which you must take to the registration table (under the tent on the beach).

**Sails & Boats** – We are providing sails for ALL divisions (except PCCSC Colleges) - College, HS Gold, HS Silver and HS Bronze. PCCSC Colleges must bring/use assigned PCCSC Coed Sail Numbers and your newest Conference Legal Sails. All others will pick up your sails from the USC/USSCLB representative on the beach. We will "mark you present" when you pick up your sails, so please make sure to do this promptly upon arrival Saturday morning. Charter boats for College and High School Teams from outside CA can be picked up by seeing the USC/USSCLB representative in the boat storage area on the beach. On Saturday night, sails should be stored in the boat, rolled neatly and tucked safely under the center thwart. You are responsible for the boat you bring (or charter/borrow) and the sails you use in the 1<sup>st</sup> rotation all weekend. Rig, put away and return that boat and those sails. You will be held responsible for this boat and sails proper care each morning and evening. You must return these sails clean with jib sheets removed.

<u>Regatta Report Forms</u> – All teams must have a Techscore account for their Record of Participation. Please enter your likely starting lineup for your team before the regatta (this can be changed at any time during the regatta) and keep the information current throughout the regatta. Final information must be complete in Techscore by the end of protest time on Sunday. Any team with incomplete or inaccurate information after protest time on Sunday in Techscore is subject to ICSA Rule 15b / ISSA Rule 4.3. Pop Up Tents and beach chairs are welcome. <u>Pop-up tents must not be larger than 10' X 10'.</u> This is a Long Beach City Ordinance for tents on the beach. Please set up all tents, chairs and other team camp paraphernalia on the beach North/West or South/East of the Granada Launch Ramp cement pad leaving the space directly between the cement pad and the water as a clear lane for launching and retrieving boats. Note that Rosie's Dog Beach (Off Leash Dog Area) starts at GLR and goes North/West up the beach. If you don't like dogs set up South/East of the GLR.

**Dinner** – There will be a dinner and College Sailing Presentation on Saturday, January 4<sup>th</sup> immediately after racing for all participants, family, friends and guests. The dinner will take place at the United States Sailing Center – Long Beach, CA - 5489 E Ocean Blvd., Long Beach, CA 90803-4405. Free Parking is available – See "Car Parking" above. The regatta entry fee includes four (4) dinners. <u>Additional dinner reservations and T-shirts may be available until 10am on Saturday at registration (or the USSCLB) if there is space available and we have T-shirts left. Prices after January 1, 2025, will be \$30 per dinner & T-shirts for \$25.</u>

<u>Bathrooms</u> – There are numerous public bathrooms in the building between the parking lot and the Granada Launch Ramp.

<u>Trash</u> – There will be lots of trash cans on the beach and in the parking lot. It is vital that we use them and keep all of the areas that we use clean. Flagrant violations of this can result in protests/penalties!

<u>Nearby Vendors</u> – There are numerous vendors in close proximity to the Granada Launch Ramp. There is a small convenience store across the street from the GLR. There is a Vons Market, 7-Eleven, and Jack in the Box less than one mile from the GLR. And there are endless restaurants and virtually all services on 2nd Street (Belmont Shore) just down Granada Ave. Note: Rosie's Dog Beach is adjacent and just North/West of our event on the Beach. Bring your dog (one dog per supervising adult – on leash until on Beach in Dog Park Area)!!!

Please respect the neighborhoods, beaches, boats and all locals and visitors. Pick up your trash, keep your gear organized and stored reasonably. Please drive carefully (NO CARS ON THE BEACH and park legally) as there are a lot of kids, cars, trailers, and boats!

**Boat Launching and Rotation Safety** – Please research, discuss and practice proper launching and rotation from a beach with small waves. At least two people should meet each boat and be in the water as it arrives. Spin the boat bow into the waves/wind ASAP and hold it by the bow or shrouds. Do not get into/out of the boat when it is sideways to the waves. Coaches/Team Leaders should take responsibility for your teams proper safe launching and rotation EACH TIME!!
