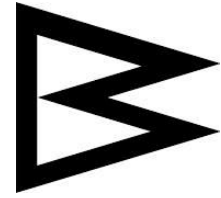

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the [ISSA Procedural Rules](#) and the [ISSA National Championship General Conditions](#) and [the Scholastic Dinghy Class Rules](#).
- 1.2. In accordance with RRS 70.3(b), decisions of the protest committee are final. US SAILING's permission has been granted.
- 1.3. The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Interscholastic Sailing Association (ISSA) and Bowdoin College
- 1.4. Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, as modified by ISSA Procedural Rule 13(c) may be in effect.
- 1.5. Rule 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: "(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or"
- 1.6. A protesting boat shall, at the first reasonable opportunity after finishing, notify the Race Committee of its intent to protest. Failure to do so makes her protest invalid. This changes rule 60.4 and ISSA PR 15b.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:

- 2.1. Official notices will be posted on the official notice board located on Tech Score.
- 2.2. Changes to the sailing instructions shall be approved by the protest committee and the ISSA Representative and posted no later than one half hour prior to the first warning signal on the day it will take effect.

3. **CODE OF CONDUCT:** [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

4. SCHEDULE:

Saturday:

- 1130 Report time/rigging of boats
- 1145 Sailor's meeting (First warning announced at Sailor's Meeting)
- 1800 No first warning for any race may start after this time.

Sunday:

- 0930 Report time/rigging of boats
- 1030 First warning
- 1500 No first warning for any race may start after this time.

- 4.1. The number of races each day will be at the discretion of the regatta chair.
- 4.2. Rotation schedules and boat assignments will be posted on Tech Score before the sailor's meeting.

5. BOATS:

- 5.1. A-Division will start in FJs
- 5.2. B-Division will start in 420s
- 5.3. The fleets will switch as close to midway through the regatta as possible at the discretion of the event chair and PRO.

6. COURSES AND MARKS:

- 6.1. Courses will be in accordance with ISSA PR 7.8
- 6.2. The race committee may designate course selection orally.
- 6.3. The starting pin will be an orange mark.
- 6.4. The windward marks will be orange, the gate marks will be yellow or green.

7. START/FINISH AND SIGNALS:

- 7.1. Races will start in accordance with ISSA PR 7.9.
- 7.2. The start/finish line will be between a red flag on the race committee boat and a mark.

8. BREAKDOWNS:

- 8.1. Breakdown requests shall be filed in the same manner as protests.
- 8.2. Breakdowns shall be scored in accordance with ISSA PR 9(e). Compensation shall be consistent with ISSA PR Appendix 3.

9. PROTESTS:

- 9.1. Protests procedure will be in accordance with ISSA PR Part VI
- 9.2. RRS 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: “(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or”
- 9.3. Protest Time Limit: The protest time limit for filing a protest or request for redress shall be 20 Minutes after the Race Committee boat has docked following the last race of the day.

10. SCORING: Scoring will be in accordance with ISSA PR 9.

- 11. **SAFETY:** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee either before leaving the course, or if that is impossible, immediately after arriving ashore.
