May 4th – Tier 3/Opti Regatta

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SIs)

1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by: 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), prescriptions of the US Sailing Association, ISSA Procedural Rules, MISSA By-laws and District Rules, NOR and the SI's.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- **2.1** Any changes to the SI's will be posted on the Official Notice Board on techscore or orally from the Race Committee Boat.
- **2.2** Changes to a sailing instruction may be made on the water by announcement from the race committee boat.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- **3.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flag pole on the upper deck.
- **3.2** When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

4 SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1 Saturday, May 4th
8:30 a.m. - Arrival
9:00 a.m. - Competitor's meeting
9:30 a.m. - Harbor Launch
10:00 a.m. - 1st warning signal
No races will be started after 4:00 p.m.

5 Boat Damage/Bosun Rule

5.1 If 420 damage cannot be attributed to a team or teams, the repair costs will be divided evenly between all the teams competing.

6 CLASS FLAGS

6.1 The Opti class will be designated with a blue opti logo on a white background. The 420 class will be designated with a blue C420 logo on a white background.

7 RACING AREA

7.1 The Racing Area will be the waters of Lake Michigan directly off the Wilmette Harbor.

8 COURSES

- **8.1** The diagram(s) in the appendix show the courses for the Opti and the 420 classes.
- **8.2** The Opti fleet will use a triangle with 4 legs. The 420 fleet will use a W4 Windward/Leeward with a dogleg finish after passing through the gate on the final leg.

9 MARKS

9.1 Marks will be yellow and orange balls. The windward mark for both fleets will be the same orange ball. Marks 2 and 3 for the Opti Fleet will be yellow balls. The gates for the 420 fleet will be orange balls.

10 THE START

- **10.1** The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee boat at the starboard end and a yellow ball on the port end.
- **10.2** The starting sequence shall be 3-minute dinghy start per RRS Appendix S
- **10.3** Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- **10.4** Code Flag "X" may be displayed for individual recalls. It is the responsibility of the yacht to make a proper start. Failure of the Race Committee to make these signals or failure of a starter on the course side to see or hear these signals shall not relieve the offending yacht from restarting and is not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- **10.5** For the 420 fleet, the starting following a General Recall will be run under an I Flag.
- **10.6** A boat that does not start within 3 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

11 THE FINISH

11.1 For the 420 fleet the finishing line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee boat at the port end and a orange ball to the starboard of the race committee boat. For the opti fleet the

finishing line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee boat at the starboard end and a yellow ball to the port of the race committee boat.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

HEARING REQUESTS

- **13.1** The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the race committee dock time.
- **13.2** Hearing request forms are available from the race office at the Sheridan Shores Office

14 Coaching

- **14.1** It is the responsibility of the coaches to know the limits of their competitors and pull competitors from racing if conditions exceed their limitations.
- **14.2** Coaches shall stay clear of the racing area unless assisting competitors. Coaching should take place to leeward of the start/finish line.


15 OFFICIAL NOTICE FOR ALL TEAMS
