On behalf of our host, Larchmont Yacht Club (LYC), we want to welcome you to our Fleet Racing Invitational.

We are thrilled that you will join us for an exciting High School Sailing event sailed in Larchmont Harbor. We are also hosting LYC Frostbiting 2026 Midwinters this Saturday and Sunday also launching off the front docks with an anticipated first warning at midday. So there will be lots of sailors around and lots of sailing to enjoy! We are fortunate to have a dedicated group of volunteers, staff, and race officials committed to running a safe, fair, and fun competition for our sailors. To help us ensure that you have the best possible experience, please take a moment to review the information below.

VEHICLE PARKING:

As it is the off-season, non-member parking is available on a limited basis at Larchmont Yacht Club. We request that you park in the middle or lower tier of the main parking lot - (not directly adjacent to the Jr Building - the Commodores' Lot). Additionally, we have ample offsite parking just outside the property on Ocean Ave and Woodbine Ave. Do not block fire lanes or pedestrian walkways.

COMPETITOR CHECK-IN & GEAR

Check in will occur on the Veranda (Waterside of Main Clubhouse). Gear bags should be left in the downstairs of the Jr Clubhouse or in the Bathhouse (Pool) Locker Rooms. NOT in the main Clubhouse bathrooms or Veranda.

COMPETITOR AREAS / RESTROOMS & SHOWERS:

The High School sailing event will be staged off the LYC front docks as close as practicable. High School Sailing Teams and Competitors are welcome to congregate (1) in the Beach Grill & Tiki Bar area (neither open for the season yet) which is reachable from the front lawn, and (2) on the LYC waterfront lawn half closest to the Beach Grill. (3) The Veranda area - depending on dining and frostbite usage. The Pando area and waterfront lawn in front of the Pando will be in use by Frostbiting Mid-winters competitors. Sailors are permitted inside the Clubhouse to keep warm subject to observation of proper decorum and no hats inside the Clubhouse. Wet clothing is requested to remain outside of the main Clubhouse at all times. Sailors are

welcome to use the Main Club House downstairs rest room facilities (access at door between bar and Pando), facilities in the Junior Clubhouse and the locker rooms in the Bath House (pool).

LYC SPECTATING: Teams and parents may view the racing from LYC's Beach Grill, Tiki Bar area (neither yet open for the season), the Veranda (when not occupied by Race Committee and Frostbiting staff in the morning) and the adjacent front lawn area. Making a left as you exit the Club's front gate, you may also take the short walk to nearby Manor Park to spectate from Umbrella Point.

NO LAUNCH SERVICE

Launch Service has not yet commenced for the season.

COACH/ SPECTATOR BOATS

There will be **NO** non-member motor boat launching / retrieval at Larchmont Yacht Club before, during or after the event. Spectating will occur from the docks / grounds only. Rotations will occur from the front "Wing Docks" where the boats are stored.

GUEST ACCOUNTS AND LYC FACILITIES; CLUB RULES

Families may create a guest account to purchase other food and beverages at LYC during the regatta. Upon arrival, check-in at the LYC front desk to provide your credit card details and receive a guest card. Your statement will be settled once all charges have been. Members of other clubs with reciprocity may also order subject to applicable reciprocity. There may be limited informal dining available in the indoor Founders Porch. In accordance with membership rules, dogs are not welcome on the grounds unless on a leash, and then only on a temporary basis in order to board a boat. While you may use your phone to access messages, apps, and email, we ask that you not use your phone to conduct conversations inside the main Clubhouse, on the Veranda, and instead step away to designated areas like the cellphone booth inside the Clubhouse, the lawn near the paddle courts and the parking lots to conduct phone conversations.

LARCHMONT AND LOCAL POINTS OF INTEREST

The Larchmont Yacht Club was founded in 1880, and has long been a bastion of dinghy, one design and PHRF racing. We are the home club to numerous national and international champions, including the winners of the 2024 Transat, 2024 Olympian and Opti veteran, Markus Edegran (Men's Kite), and the 2018 U.S. Rolex Yachtswomen of the Year, Carmen and Emma Cowles. This year among many other events, we are excited to host 2026 USODA Optimist Team Racing Nationals and look forward to marking LYC's 150th Anniversary in 2030.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

Recycling and trash containers will be positioned throughout the racing venue. If you use our sustainable aluminum cups, please return them to designated areas for reuse and do not throw them out. Please do your part to keep Long Island Sound and our venue clean. Do not throw or allow anything in the water. A water refill station is located on the bar accessible from the Veranda and in the lower level of the Junior Sailing Building.

NEARBY RESOURCES

There are numerous local delis for breakfast and lunch options, including Manor Deli, Empire Bagels, Bagels by Sofia and Trax Deli in Larchmont, Sage Deli and Fenimore Deli in Mamaroneck. You may wish to call in your order ahead of time on busy weekend mornings. In New Rochelle, you have Lupinos and Pops Deli, and from New Rochelle up to Larchmont on the Boston Post Road (a/k/a Route 1, Main Street), you also have Bagel Zone, Dunkin Donuts, and more. For more leisurely morning fare in Larchmont, we recommend La Parisienne Bakery, Bradleys Café & Desserts, and Stanz Café. For prepared foods and sandwiches, there's also La Meateria nearby in Larchmont and DeCicco's Grocery on Palmer Road in Larchmont. If you're out and about during the day, registered national historic landmark Walters Hot Dog Stand has been serving since 1919 and is considered one of the best in the country.

Popular dinner options include Tequila Sunrise (great for groups), Sherwoods (the place for Ribs), Fuji Mountain (Japanese hibachi and sushi), Villa Maria Pizza, Augies Italian family style and the Larchmont

Tavern.
